- 1. Legislation: so far, the Law of Hong Kong is not so explicit to computer-related crime, such as ID theft. Even Evidence Ordinance is not so clear, sometime, computer is considered as a person in order to fit the Evidence Ordinance. It is essential to re-organize to form a book of Law for computer-related crime.
- 2. System requirement and Best Practice: Many corporation and SME in Hong Kong just don't care on the security of their information system and their practice. This created a lot of vulnerability for hackers to use their platform attacking others. Government should take initiative to release a set of best practice such as the G-8 requirement (see attached, which was freely vailable in the web-site listed at the last pages)
- 3. Privatization: Technology is running fast. It is more suitable to leave the public to do their own selection. Government should keep the moral stand and ensu4re the technological development according to social moral. The new governmental strategies should favor instead of killing technology development.
